Introduction

Thank you for your interest in volunteering as a Steward at this year's Bideford Folk Festival. Without the time and unstinting efforts of volunteers like yourselves the Festival simply would not happen, so thank you again. Stewards will be given a pass that gives access to all Festival events plus free camping at the Festival's own campsite. In return, Stewards will be asked to undertake approximately 3-4 hours of duties per day. Wherever possible Stewards will be allocated tasks in line with their stated preferences and events, but this cannot be guaranteed and some flexibility on the part of individual Stewards will be greatly appreciated.

What's involved?

Stewards act as the friendly and helpful face of the Bideford Folk Festival. Their most common role is to meet and greet, provide information and be ready to answer queries from the public. They don't need to know all the answers, just point people in the right direction. Stewards are not surrogate 'bouncers'. They are not responsible for controlling unacceptable behaviour or crowd control. There may be some Festival requirements regarding flash photography, recording or alcohol in certain venues but a bit of tact and diplomacy usually goes a long way. Previous Bideford Folk Festivals have not had any problems of that sort, and this year should be no different. All Stewards will receive a pass, identifying sash, and a Steward's handbook. This will give details of individual venues, contact numbers and clear guidance on the roles and responsibilities of a Steward. All Stewards will also be required to attend a short orientation and training event before they start their duties.

Stewards will be divided into teams responsible for:

- a) Events at a venue or set of venues
- b) Festival office and administration
- c) General support, including setting up and breaking down venues and the campsite
- d) Technical support
- e) Specialist roles, minibus driving, bar work, first aider etc

All Stewards will be given a programme of their week's anticipated tasks on arrival and be introduced to their team leader.

Terms and Conditions

1. Under current legislation, it is not possible to reward Stewards in payment or in kind, for any of their allotted tasks. Any provision of free access to camping and Festival events is to enable Stewards to carry out their tasks more easily and should not be interpreted as payment. Similarly, Bideford Folk Festival Ltd understand that any agreement to undertake duties or tasks are voluntarily entered into, therefore, this document does not seek to represent any form of contract of employment nor should it be interpreted as such.
2. All Stewards must be over 18 yrs of age by 11/08/08
3. When working with the public, Stewards must not be under the influence of drink or drugs and must be in a fit state to carry out their duties.
4. As a Steward your priority is to help the Bideford Folk Festival run smoothly. If you have a preference regarding your allocated team we will do our best to accommodate you but cannot give any guarantee to do so. Stewards may well be asked to undertake more than one specific role.
5. Please understand that duties may require standing for prolonged periods, interaction with the public and some lifting and handling tasks. If you have any concerns about your ability to safely undertake these please discuss the matter with your GP before applying.
6. All Stewards must undertake a short training and must use the instructions and advice given during the training and in the Steward's handbook to ensure their own safety and that of all members of the public.
